

FLORIDA EDUCATION FUND LAWS OF LIFE ESSAY CONTEST

THEME. “Laws of Life”

PURPOSE. The *Laws of Life* are core values and ideals by which we live. Honesty, perseverance, and the Golden Rule all are examples of these universal “laws” that transcend religions, cultures, and national borders. The *Laws of Life* Essay Contest offers a young person the opportunity to think about and communicate the principles that guide his or her life. As a participant writes his or her essay, the participant must select the quotation below that expresses a key value and/or ideal by which he or she lives and explain why the chosen value/ideal is important to the way he or she lives his or her life by discussing experiences, lessons learned, and people who have served as living examples of the chosen value/ideal.

ELIGIBILITY. Members of the Centers of Excellence Program (i.e., National Achievers and Believers) in grades 3 through 12 may participate. There are three divisions: Grades 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12.

REQUIREMENTS. Essays of 100-300 words **must** be submitted to the Center Director no later than 4:00 p.m., January 31, 2025. Attach this application to the essay.

Center Directors will submit all essays to the Florida Education Fund by February 14, 2025, and will be notified of the essay winners for each division by March 10, 2025. The winners will be expected to read a portion of their winning essays (no more than one minute) at the Florida National Achievers Society Summit to be held in March 2024 in central Florida.

JUDGING. The following criteria will be used for judging an essay: Content = 5 points; Presentation = 3 points; and Grammar and Spelling = 2 points. Judges will be selected who understand the writing levels of the essay participants, i.e., the writing skills taught to meet and defined by the Florida State standards: an elementary professional for 3th-5th graders, a middle school professional for 6th-8th graders, and a high school professional for 9th-12th graders.

ELIGIBILITY: A judge must be someone who appreciates the ideals of the *Laws of Life* Essay Contest. A judge **cannot** be a parent or immediate family member of a current contest participant.

CRITERIA: Students must be able to demonstrate the writing process and communicate ideas and information effectively. The following criteria should be met: **Content** - the student was able to explain his or her *law of life*. **Presentation** - the essay is clearly written and easy to read. **Grammar/Spelling** - the essay was written with few grammatical and spelling errors.

SCORING: Essays will be scored in three categories on a scale from 1 - 5. The highest overall score for an essay is 10 points.
